OUTSIDE SCHOOL HOURS CARE

The Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) operates from Room 5 in Block B.

The program involves children engaging in safe, healthy activities. Children find fun, games, laughter and stimulating activities in OSHC. They love to socialise and make new friends.

Morning care serves a delicious range of foods for the children to enjoy while in the program, available until 8am.

Afternoon snacks are provided in the evenings consisting of fruit/sandwiches/cheese & biscuits.

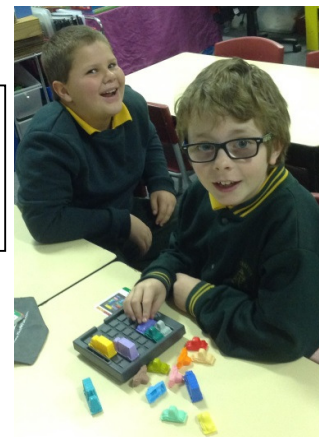
The children are encouraged to assist in the menu choices which are provided.

OSHC do charge a fee, however all families are eligible for a government rebate through Childcare benefits. **Cost** Permanent - \$16 mornings & \$20 afternoons. Casual bookings - \$19 mornings & \$22 afternoons.

*Permanent is having your child booked in on certain mornings/nights

*Casual is when your child will be attending as needed.
